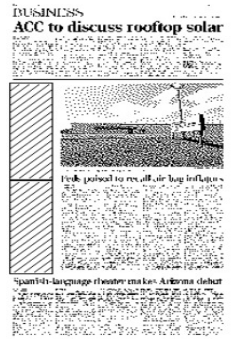

Long Realty: Long Realty's Lisa Bayless, a sales agent at the Oro Valley office, donated a third Belgian Malinois K-9 patrol dog to the town's police force. The new dog, K-9 Cash, joins two other Bayless donations: K-9 Risu (2020) and K-9 Diesel (2019). The donations are part of Bayless' "Community First" program, which returns to community causes at least \$500 from each commission she earns. Her 2022 giving total reached the \$123,000 mark; now at \$80,000, her 2023 total is projected to hit the \$100,000 level. The value of K-9 Cash is \$12,500, paid in full by Bayless.
